of the GRUR International. The responsibilities are to be shared with one additional Executive Co-Editor already working in the Journal's Editorial Office located in Munich, Germany. The position is part-time – 50 percent. The remaining 50 percent can be optionally complemented with a research position at the Institute depending on the fulfilment of academic qualifications. The position is for a period of two years with the option of extending the contract.

The Executive Editors have their office at the Institute. Regarding their activity for the journal, they are formally employed by GRUR.

### Requirements for the Executive Co-Editor Position

- Fluent in English, ideally native skills
- Professional or academic experience in IP law; familiarity with related areas is a plus
- Aptitude for scholarly work; Ph.D. title or similar qualifications is a plus

### Requirements for the Position of Research Fellow

- Ph.D. title in intellectual property is desired, although doctoral students at the final stages of their research will also be considered
- Publications in international academic journals in topics within traditional IP legal areas is a plus

## Desired Skills

- Ability to identify cutting-edge topics in IP law and related areas, and identify the leading academics and practitioners in the field
- Academic skills to understand complex issues also outside the own areas of expertise
- Inductive reasoning skills and ability to write headnotes for court decisions from various jurisdictions
- Organisational talent, with the ability to keep an overview of open issues
- Long-term planning skills, with the aptitude to anticipate future opportunities
- Ability to work independently and take well founded decisions
